Shostakovich's *Cello Sonata in D Movement 2* is typical of his tumultuous and emotional compositional style, reflective of his political and cultural context. He wrote it when he fell in love and had an affair with a young woman at the Leningrad festival, and he premiered the piece in late 1934 with his close friend, cellist Viktor Kubatsky.

Allegro Sonata is an exciting work for tuba and piano, inspired by Schoenberg's first chamber symphony. The piece shows the tuba in a unique light: a virtuosic instrument quickly going between high floating lines into the treble clef, and an instrument laying down a deep foundation to the piano's flowing lines and everything in between.

Walton's *Viola Concerto*, composed in 1929, is widely accepted to be the greatest concerto written for viola. The concerto explores a wide range of the instrument's tone colour, taking advantage of its mellow qualities.

Composer/Voice On Love: A Lesson In Three Chapters

On Love is a lesson learned in three chapters for an unaccompanied SATB vocal ensemble, inspired by the close harmonies of Australian a cappella ensemble The Idea of North. Three musically distinct sections integrate different period features of SATB vocal music and jazz — both in the traditional treatment of close harmony and musical style, with more contemporary disco and pop-infused genre elements subtly referenced in the second chapter.

Bassoon Vivaldi Bassoon Concerto in E minor, RV 484: I. Allegro poco

Antonio Vivaldi's *Bassoon Concerto in E Minor, RV 484* captivating first movement, *Allegro poco*, showcases the bassoon's versatility; intertwining its rich, expressive timbre with vibrant





orchestral textures. The dynamic dialogue between the soloist and the ensemble creates a dramatic and engaging atmosphere, making it a standout example of Vivaldi's Baroque mastery.

The Quartessense, written for two trumpets and two flugelhorns, explores interweaving melodies between all the instruments. The ensemble tackles a development section full of twists and turns before finally returning to its roots.

Vejo Konfliktas (“battle of the winds” in Lithuanian) is a dynamic saxophone quartet that explores the concept of conflict and resolution through contrasting textures, rhythmic interplay, and harmonic tension. Inspired by the volatile nature of wind, the piece weaves between moments of turbulence and calm, showcasing the expressive capabilities of the saxophone ensemble.

Composer/Electric guitar José Feng Shui

This composition is a mixture of many unique Japanese jazz-fusion elements. These include voice-like guitar melodies, bright slap bass, powerful, intricate drum patterns, and lush clustered electric piano chords. Influenced primarily by T-square and Casiopea, the piece aims to take the listener on a journey, each instrument having soloistic and supporting roles to create a balanced musical conversation.

Piano *Feux d'artifice from Préludes, Book II No.12*

Feux d'artifice from Préludes, Book II No.12 is the final work concluding Claude Debussy's 24 Preludes, a quasi-programmatic composition depicting the grand firework display on Bastille Day. His experimentation with untraditional harmonic progressions, non-chordal tones, and whole-tone scales obscure the line between nature and imagination, painting a scene with the music.

Musicology

Musicology is the study of music theory, presented either in essay form (for Music 2 and Music Extension) or as a viva voce presentation (for Music 1). In the essay format, students explore one or more aspects of music in depth, demonstrating a deep understanding of the topic studied. The Musicology viva voce, on the other hand, is an interactive discussion between the examiner and candidate, where the candidate must showcase their comprehension of the concepts and stylistic features of the music they have studied.
