Bumping up education results for children

Increase the proportion of public school students in the top two NAPLAN bands (or equivalent) for literacy and numeracy by 15% by 2023, including through a state-wide rollout of Bump it Up.

Glossary

- **Proportion of students in the top two bands**
 - The measure is the simple average of the proportion of NSW public school students with NAPLAN results in the top two bands from the reading and numeracy tests across year 3, 5, 7 and 9.
 - For each test domain (reading and numeracy) and each year level, a student's result is in the top two bands if it meets the following criteria:
 - Year 3 – band 5 or above
 - Year 5 – band 7 and above
 - Year 7 – band 8 and above
 - Year 9 – band 9 and above
 - Proportions are calculated based on all students who sat the tests as well those who were exempt from the tests (who are deemed not to be in the top two bands).
 - **It Includes** results of students enrolled at NSW public schools; results for both reading and numeracy
 - **It Excludes** results for writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation; results of students enrolled at non-government schools
