Cummeragunja Reserve is a settlement on the New South Wales side of the Murray River, on the Victorian border near Barmah. The reserve houses a fluctuating population between 70 – 100 residents and encompasses the Viney Morgan Medical Centre. The reserve is approximately 30 kms to the north east of Moama and is serviced by Ambulance Victoria. The management of the reserve is under the Cummeragunja Aboriginal Lands Council.
