### Glossary

<b>Proportion of Aboriginal students attaining their high school certificate (HSC)</b>	The number of Aboriginal students attaining their HSC each year, divided by the potential Aboriginal Year 12 population in each year.
<b>Potential Aboriginal year 12 population</b>	The number of Aboriginal students who could complete Year 12 in the reference year, based on the enrolment records of students enrolled in Year 9 three years previously.  <b>Includes</b> Both government and non-government school students
<b>Reference year</b>	The year in which the students would typically be in Year 12. A number of students will complete their HSC over three years rather than two years (i.e. they will attain their HSC in the year after the reference year). This will be captured as revisions.
