Note Ramps shown are unformed small craft access points only.

Caution: The whole of Congo Creek is a Four Knot Zone. Beware of swimmers.

WARNING: The entrance bar to Congo Creek is dangerous and is not considered navigable.

Warning: The river west of the Princes Highway Bridge is shallow with many unmarked rocks and shoals.

Note: Princes Highway Bridge Clearance 5.4m above MHW. Navigation span at northern end marked with port and starboard daymarks.

Caution: Shallow waters (less than 2 metres depth) can contain seagrass and other sensitive fish habitats, which are at risk of damage from boat propellers. Please exercise care when navigating or anchoring in shallow waters and avoid damaging or disturbing seagrass beds.

WARNING: OVERHEAD AND SUBMARINE CABLES AND PIPES CROSS THESE WATERWAYS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS AND ARE USUALLY INDICATED BY WARNING NOTICES ON THE SHORE. CAUTION SHOULD BE EXERCISED AT ALL TIMES WHILE NAVIGATING IN THE VICINITY OF THESE CROSSINGS.
