Caution: Extensive oyster leases exist in the waterways of Tuross Lake and Broadwater. Please observe speed and wash limits to avoid damage to oyster farms.

Caution: Shallow waters (less than 2 metres depth), can contain seagrass and other sensitive fish habitats, which are at risk of damage from boat propellers.

Please exercise care when navigating or anchoring in shallow waters and avoid damaging or disturbing seagrass beds.

Note: Coila Lake can be shallow in various places. Navigate with caution. Launching ramps shown are unformed, small craft access points only.

Caution: Turross Lake is very shallow. Stay within marked channels.

Note: Bank erosion is a serious problem in the Turross River. Please do not create wash and keep to the speed limits.

Caution: The Turross River west of Cambathin Island is very shallow. Navigate with care.

Caution: Navigable channel in this area is constantly changing.

CAUTION: WHEN OPEN TO THE SEA, THE ENTRANCE BAR IS EXTREMELY DANGEROUS AT ALL TIMES. SEE NOTES BELOW.

Note: It is compulsory to carry certain safety equipment, including a lifejacket type 100 or greater for all on board whilst navigating in the open (ocean) waters.

It is also compulsory that lifejackets be worn while crossing all entrance bars shown on this map.
