Note: It is compulsory to carry certain safety equipment including a lifejacket Level 100 plus for all on board, whilst navigating in the open sea. It is also compulsory that lifejackets be worn whilst crossing most entrance bars shown on this map. The Marine Safety Regulation 2016 requires vessels on open water ie out from the coast, to have an appropriate map or chart on board. This map is deemed to be an appropriate map for recreational vessels undertaking voyages within a 15 nautical mile radius from the point of departure from the coast, (as defined approximately by red dashed lines). Vessels undertaking longer voyages than that stated above MUST carry an appropriate chart (ie an Admiralty or Australian Hydrographic Service chart or E-Chart) showing the area proposed for the voyage or excursion. It is the vessel masters responsibility to ensure that they are in possession of the latest edition of this boating map, chart or E-Chart with the latest corrections.
