If you're eligible, you'll get \$450 if any of the following apply: • you lost at least 8 hours of work • you lost less than 20 hours of work • you couldn't work a full day for that week. Test and Isolate support payments	One \$320 payment in a four week period for lost wages for eligible workers aged 17 and over in NSW, who have symptoms of COVID-19, get tested and isolate until a negative result is returned.	Applications are now open for tests taken on or after 9 September 2021 due to experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.	You'll need to apply for the payment within 7 days of having the test. Support for micro-businesses (including sole traders) and small non-profits



To be eligible, your business or organisation must have a turnover between \$30,000 and \$75,000 per year, and your revenue has declined by 30% or more.

Support with my retail or commercial tenancy	Landlords can't evict or lock out impacted retail or commercial tenants (with turnover up to \$50m) without mediation. The parties must negotiate rent relief with consideration to the National Code of Conduct. Land tax relief for landlords who reduce the rent for impacted commercial tenants up to 100% of their 2021 land tax liability. Monthly grants of up to \$3,000 for small commercial landlords that face financial hardship by providing rent relief and have not claimed land tax relief between 1 July 2021 and 31 December 2021.	These protections will last for the whole lockdown. The Retail and Other Commercial Leases (COVID-19) Regulation 2021 expires on 13 January 2022. Land tax relief applies to rental reductions provided from 1 July to 31 December 2021. Monthly hardship payments commenced from 13 August 2021 and will continue until the Government announces the end of the Scheme. Not-for-Profit (NFP) JobSaver for charitable NFP social support and animal welfare organisations	Payments equivalent to JobSaver for eligible charitable NFP* organisations that have experienced a decline in turnover of a minimum of 15 per cent but less than 30 per cent. Eligible charitable NFPs will receive: • the equivalent of 40% of pre-COVID NSW weekly payroll, from \$1,500 to \$100,000 per week (paid fortnightly) for employing NFPs; • \$1,000 weekly for non-employing NFPs. *Eligible charitable NFPs must be registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) under one of the following subtypes: • 'advancing social or public welfare', or • 'preventing or relieving animal suffering'.	Fortnightly payments will be backdated to the start of the fortnight they first experienced the required decline in turnover on or after the commencement of JobSaver on 18 July 2021.
