### Aboriginal Arts and Culture (3) \$122,270

#### 1. Orana Arts Inc, Burrbgaja Yalirra: Dancing Forwards (\$37,270)

Orana Arts will tour Marrugeku's established production 'Burrbgaja Yalirra' in regional NSW at three locations across the Warrumbungles, Wellington and Mid-North Coast.
 *Burrbgaja Yalirra* showcases leading change-makers in intercultural contemporary dance and explores facets of reciprocity that challenge a sense of belonging in Australia. The performances will engage seven First Nations artists/arts workers and will include a series of workshops to help young people to become their own storytellers.

# 2. Mr Rhyan Clapham, WARRANGU; River Story Tour supported by BARKAA and Kelsey Iris (\$75,000)

DOBBY + Band, BARKAA and Kelsey Iris will present new music through WARRANGU;
River Story, touring in Dubbo, Walgett, Bourke, Brewarrina, Wilcannia, Menindee, Broken
Hill, Mildura, and Wagga Wagga. WARRANGU; River Story documents the cultural
knowledge of the three rivers that form the surrounding tribal boundaries in Brewarrina
and raises awareness of issues of over-irrigation and water theft within the region.

#### 3. Taragara Aboriginal Corporation, tour of Looking Through Windows (\$10,000)

 Looking Through Windows is a multimedia exhibition that explores the removal, dispossession, and protection' of Aboriginal people in NSW. The tour will take the exhibition to three venues in regional NSW - Armidale, Newcastle, and Broken Hill.

### Classical Music (4) \$367,395

### 1. Dr Aristea Mellos, tour of Bach in the Gardens of NSW (\$19,200)

 Dr Aristea Mellos will present a regional tour of the Bach at the Calyx concert series to gardens across the Blue Mountains, Mudgee, Cowra, Orange, and Oberon during the school holidays of 2021 and 2022.

#### 2. Omega Ensemble, Regional NSW Touring Program (\$80,000)

 Omega Ensemble will re-stage the production of Night and Now for regional NSW audiences. The tour will include both public performance and workshop activities, with a focus on high-quality audience experiences, extending practice-based research and fostering long-term regional partnerships.

# 3. Pinchgut Opera Ltd, Pinchgut Opera's Regional Tour (\$225,676)

Pinchgut Opera will tour Monteverdi's Vespers to Newcastle and Armidale. Pinchgut
Opera will also facilitate workshops to coincide with the performances to connect local

# 1. Runaway Records, Little Quirks - Underwater EP Launch Tour (\$18,679)

• The five-piece band Little Quirks will undertake a 13-date tour of regional and metropolitan cities across NSW to promote the release of their upcoming EP *Underwater*.

# Dance and Physical Theatre (2) \$185,118

### 1. Flipside Dance Inc, tour of Awkward (\$150,000)

• Catapult will deliver a NSW regional tour of the contemporary dance-theatre performance *Awkward*. *Awkward* will tour to 25 destinations from Newcastle to Broken Hill and will incorporate a youth workshop program. The tour will offer employment to 10 regional artists and crew over 10 weeks.

### 2. Shaun Parker and Company Ltd, TROLLEYS on the Road NSW Tour (\$35,118)

Shaun Parker and Company Ltd will tour a production of TROLLEYS on the Road, an
outdoor performance for community audiences consisting of new works HOVER and
Found Objects and extant work TROLLEYS on the Road. TROLLEYS on the Road will tour to
Shoalhaven, Newcastle, and Port Macquarie delivering 22 performances, 32 workshops
and will employ seven artists and crew over 4 weeks.

# 1. International Performing Writers Association, Australian Poetry Slam NSW Tour 2021 (\$74,270)

 International Performing Writers Association will tour a poetry slam program across regional and metropolitan NSW, culminating at the Sydney Opera House. New and emerging poets will be invited to participate in workshops and perform for local audiences with experienced headliners before travelling to a final show in Sydney. The Australian Poetry Slam Tour will be recorded professionally for distribution through websites and a podcast.

#### Theatre and Musical Theatre (11) \$988,435

#### 1. CDP Theatre Producers Pty Ltd, tour of Guess How Much I Love You (\$76,552)

• CDP will tour their new Australian adaptation of *Guess How Much I Love You*, a play for children 18 months and over, based on the award-winning book with the same title, *Guess How Much I Love You*, and will tour across nine regional NSW locations.

# 2. Contemporary Asian Australian Performance Inc, tour of Double Delicious (\$80,546)

 Contemporary Asian Australian Performance Inc will tour the food and storytelling show, *Double Delicious. Double Delicious* will have 17 performances across regional NSW locations Wagga Wagga, Wollongong, and Wyong.
