INSTRUMENT OF DELEGATIONS

Section 12 of the *Education Standards Authority Act 2013* (the NESA Act) allows the Board of the NSW Education Standards Authority (the NESA Board) to delegate to an authorised person or body the exercise of any of its functions under the education and teaching legislation (defined as the NESA Act, the Education Act 1990 and the Teacher Accreditation Act 2004.)

Delegations are formally conferred by means of an instrument. The NESA Board approved this Instrument of Delegation at its meeting of 10 December 2024 pursuant to Section 12 of the NESA Act.

A number of delegations set out in this Instrument are subject to delegations conferred by the Deputy Premier on 10 December 2024 pursuant to the relevant delegation provisions of the education and teaching legislation.

As a general rule, when one of the delegates is absent for more than one day and the matter cannot reasonably await the delegate's return, the delegations are vested in the officer/s authorised to act in the delegate's role.

Where principals or equivalent are listed in the delegation, this is taken to mean principals or equivalent of:

- · government secondary or composite schools
- · schools registered by NESA
- schools outside NSW recognised by NESA
- TAFE NSW training delivery locations
- when acting in relation to the Higher School Certificate for students at their own school/college.

The exercise of these delegations is at all times consistent with NESA policies and rules and the applicable provisions of the *Government Sector Employment Act 2013*, *Government Sector Finance Act 2018* and other relevant legislation, regulations, rules and directions.

This instrument rescinds and replaces any earlier delegations in relation to the same subject matter.

These delegations have effect on and from 10 December 2024.
