



FAIL TO NOMINATE FINE

Companies are required **by law** to nominate the driver of a company vehicle at the time of a camera detected offence. Penalties apply to companies who fail to nominate.

PENALTIES

Camera detected fines issued to companies are **5 times** the amount paid by an individual. The company is required to nominate the driver responsible for the offence within the specified time frame. At this time, the fine will be issued in their name and will be reduced to the applicable individual amount.

If the company does not nominate the driver, it will receive a **fail to nominate fine** in addition to the original fine. Repeated offences will be referred to court with further possible penalties of up to \$22,000 being applied. The failure to nominate will also be referred to Transport NSW who have the authority to suspend the company vehicle's registration.

RECORD KEEPING

We encourage companies to maintain vehicle logbooks to correctly identify the drivers of their vehicles.

Where there are insufficient records, the company must satisfy that it has thoroughly investigated and made significant attempts to determine the driver responsible.

NOMINATING ONLINE

Nominating a driver is quick and easy to do via the myPenalty portal on the Revenue NSW website.

Enter the fine number and the date of the offence listed on the fine, then go to 'Name the person responsible' and enter the details requested.

Nominating ensures that demerit points are properly allocated. Demerit points are issued to encourage safe and responsible driving.

If you don't know who was driving

As the registered owner of the vehicle, you are responsible for any offence until the driver is nominated.
