

During 17 November 2020 to 15 March 2021, visitors to the 'Have Your Say' website were able to participate in the conversation about the property tax proposal. The website attracted more than 23,800 visits, 6,152 responses to the quick poll and 3,544 survey completions.


- Once a property is subject to the property tax, subsequent owners would not pay stamp duty and must pay the annual property tax
- The property tax would consist of a fixed amount plus a rate applied to the unimproved land value of an individual property, like council rates.
- If you are not buying a property, there is no change. If you have already paid stamp duty on that property, then you will not have to pay the property tax. There will be no double taxation
- Residential owners and farmers would pay lower property tax rates than residential investors, who in turn would pay lower rates than commercial property owners
- Price thresholds would initially exclude people buying the most expensive properties from choosing the property tax, but over 80 per cent of residential properties would be eligible to choose the property tax
- Tenant's agreement.
- Protections would apply so that the property tax does not result in rent increases without a tenant's agreement

- A hardship scheme should ensure that no one facing financial hardship needs to sell their home to meet property tax liabilities
- Over the long-term, the property tax would replace the Government revenue currently provided by stamp duty and land tax. The amount of revenue should not increase or decrease
- Existing stamp duty concessions for first home buyers should be replaced with a \$25,000 grant



DO YOU OWN A RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY IN NSW?



HOW MANY RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES DO YOU OWN?





WHAT IS YOUR BUDGET?














