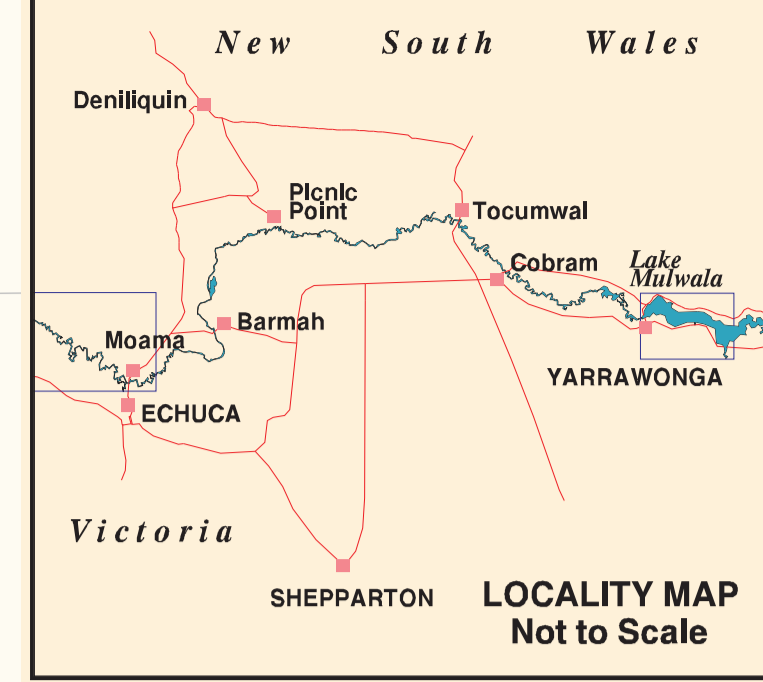

Weir construction completed in 1939

Maximum Operating Level 125.15 metres AHD

Normal operating Level 124.6 - 124.9 metres AHD

Full Capacity 117,500 Megalitres

Surface Area approximately 4,400 Hectares

Lake Mulwala Supplies approximately half of the entire water that is diverted from the River Murray system via Mulwala and Yarrowonga Canals. For further information visit www.mba.gov.au or from Goulburn Murray Water www.g-water.com.au
