CAUTION: The entrance to Brisbane Water is encumbered by sandbanks upon which heavy breakers occur in south winds.

CAUTION: Shallow waters (less than 2 metres depth), can contain seagrass and other sensitive fish habitats, which are at risk of damage from boat propellers.

Please exercise care when navigating or anchoring in shallow waters and avoid damaging or disturbing seagrass beds.

CAUTION: Little Box Head to Ettalong Area Due to constantly changing shoals, port and starboard buoys are being repositioned as necessary to indicate the best available channel.

Note: Bar WARNING applies to all waters west of the marked navigation channel.

CAUTION: Major submarine telecommunication cables in this area.

SEE SAFETY EQUIPMENT NOTES

CAUTION: Vessels entering from seaward should keep to eastern shore from Little Box Head to Wagstaffe Point. Entrance channel is not suitable for deep draft vessels at lower tides.

WARNING: BOMBORAS CAN BREAK AT ANYTIME AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS ALONG THE COAST. EXTREME CAUTION SHOULD BE EXERCISED WHILE NAVIGATING IN THE VICINITY OF ANY SHOAL, REEF OR BOMBORA.

Note: This area classified as Limited Open Waters. When waves exceed 0.5 metres from trough to crest in any part of this area, waters are Open Waters.
