TRADE AND INVESTMENT MISSION TO INDIA BY THE DR GEOFF LEE MP NSW PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY FOR MULTICULTURALISM 24 - 30 OCTOBER 2015 POST MISSION REPORT

MISSION PURPOSE

India is a NSW Government priority market and has potential for continued growth in two way trade. Consistent with the *NSW International Engagement Strategy (2013)*, Dr Lee's Mission to India aimed to:

- represent the Premier and the NSW Government at the Australian-India Leadership Dialogue, and
- progress development of the skills initiative under our Sister State Relationship with Gujarat.
- promote NSW VET capabilities.

MISSION DESCRIPTION

Dr Lee visited three cities, Delhi, Amritsar and Ahmedabad, over four days. A primary focus of the mission was to represent the NSW Government at the inaugural Australia India Leadership Dialogue being held in Delhi, India is 26-27 October. India is a priority market for NSW and representation at this high level event will support the growth in trade and investment between NSW and India. Dr Lee also progressed development of the NSW Government's skills initiative under our Sister State Relationship with Gujarat.

MISSION BACKGROUND

The NSW International Engagement Strategy (2013) identifies 10 priority markets and aims to have high level visits to each of these markets each year to promote trade and investment. The Mission undertaken by Dr Lee included the priority market of India and the State of Gujarat with which NSW shares a sister-state relationship.

Regular engagement is central to the continued fostering of strong economic relationships with key markets. While this market is a strong bilateral trading partner with NSW, the India economy is growing at a rapid pace and there is potential for enhancement of this trading relationship.

Delhi

Dr Lee visited Delhi on 25-26 October 2015 to progress the NSW-India government to government relationship and trade and investment at the highest level. Dr Lee represented the NSW Premier and the NSW Government at the inaugural Australia India Leadership Dialogue.

While in Delhi, Dr Lee:

 participated in all sessions of the Australia-India Leadership Dialogue with members of the Australian Commonwealth Government, The Indian Government and business leaders from both Australia and India.

<u>Amritsar</u>

Dr Lee visited Amritsar on 27 October to progress the NSW-Punjab government to government relationship at the highest level and to promote the NSW' Government's expertise in vocational education and training.

While in Amritsar, Dr Lee:

- Undertook a cultural visit to the Golden Temple and Jallianwala.
- Met the Mayor of Amritsar, Mr Bakshi Ram Arora to promote the NSW Gvoernment's Vocational education and training capabilities.
- · Met with Dr Mehal Singh, Principal of Khalsa College to identify training needs in Punjab, and
- Undertook a tour of Khalsa College

Ahmedabad

Dr Lee visited Ahmedabad in Gujarat on 28 October, 2015 to progress the NSW-Gujarat sisterstate relationship.

While in Ahmedabad, Dr Lee:

- Undertook a cultural visit to the Ghandi Ashram to pay homage to Mahatma Ghandi.
- Met with the Director of Manufacturing of Ford India, Mr Kel Kearns to discuss skills and training and to gain an understanding of the plant's need for upskilling its workforce.
- Met with the Gujarat Minister for Transport, Water Supply, Labour and Employment to progress the NSW-Gujarat sister-state relationship by discussing Gujarat's need for vocational education and training.
- Presented a cheque on behalf of the Commonwealth Government to the Aga Khan Rural Support Program.

KEY OUTCOMES

1. Further developed the NSW - India and NSW - Gujarat relationships

Dr Lee met with government leaders including the Gujarat Minister for Transport, Water Supply, Labour and Employment and the Mayor of Amritsar.

In **Gujarat**, NSW will work with the Gujarat Government to further explore areas in which the NSW Government can offer expertise in vocational education and training services sector.

2. Promote NSW Education

Share learnings on Indian vocational education and training needs to increase the NSW educational presence in India.
