Mission to China and the Philippines by The Honourable Gladys Berejiklian MP Premier of New South Wales 3-8 December 2017 Mission Report

PURPOSE OF TRAVEL

The NSW Premier undertook a business mission to China and the Philippines from 3 to 8 December 2017 to achieve the following objectives:

- To attend the Joint Economic Meeting (JEM), the cornerstone event of the Guangdong-NSW Sister State relationship, at the invitation of the Governor of Guangdong.
- To support NSW businesses by promoting our globally competitive capability in financial services, infrastructure and urban revitalisation, medical services, education and technology, as well as the strength of the NSW economy and ease of doing business.
- To attract international investment into NSW and generate interest in the NSW Government's significant infrastructure pipeline and the Western Sydney airport precinct.
- To grow NSW's relationship and business partnerships with Chinese companies already in NSW.
- To strengthen ties with the Philippines and promote greater business partnerships.

BENEFITS OF TRAVEL FOR THE STATE OF NEW SOUTH WALES

International missions by the Premier comprise a critical part of the NSW Government's efforts to promote trade and investment. International trade and investment account for a significant portion of the NSW economy, supporting jobs in metropolitan and regional NSW. NSW businesses exported \$65 billion worth of goods and services in 2016, equivalent to 12% of NSW's Gross State Product. International investment into NSW creates around 11,500 new jobs each year (2015).

China is a priority market for NSW trade and investment. China is NSW's second largest export market and fifth largest source of international investment. Chinese-born residents represent the largest migrant community in NSW. China is also NSW largest source of international students and tourists.

Strong growth in the Philippines' Gross Domestic Product (6.6% in 2017), in two-way merchandise trade between NSW and the Philippines (33.8% in 2016-17) and in visitors from the Philippines to NSW (25.5% in 2016-17) suggest the potential for future growth, making the Philippines an important partner for NSW. NSW has a large Filipino community and the highest number of Filipino international students in Australia.

KEY MISSION OUTCOMES

Guangdong Province, China – 3 to 6 December 2017

Supported stronger business partnerships through the Joint Economic Meeting

The Premier attended the 26th JEM in Guangzhou and met with the Party Secretary and Governor of Guangdong to reaffirm the 38 year Sister State relationship with Guangdong Province. The biennial JEM, held alternately in Sydney and Guangzhou, is the cornerstone of the relationship. This relationship has proven to be effective and mutually beneficial, particularly in fostering cultural, trade and investment relationships.

Accompanying the Premier was a business delegation of over 50 leaders from the following industry streams:

- innovation in the healthcare and medical devices sector (MedTech)
- innovation in the education technology services sector (EduTech)
- innovation in the financial services sector (FinTech)
- smart cities and urban revitalisation (Smart Cities)

The members of the business delegation engaged with their Guangdong counterparts to discuss innovation and collaboration opportunities going forward.

The Premier's attendance at the event ensured a high level of attendance by Guangdong businesses, offering strong opportunities for NSW delegates. Strong government-to-government relationships are an important factor in business success in China.

Any and all costs incurred by the participating business delegation were met by the individual delegates.

Generated interest in investment opportunities in NSW

During her first official visit to China as Premier of NSW, the Premier met with investors in infrastructure and other sectors, along with financiers.

The Premier provided assurance of the NSW Government's commitment to further partnerships and highlighted the potential for greater engagement and investment into NSW.

The Premier discussed the next stage of growth for NSW, including opportunities associated with NSW unprecedented \$73 billion infrastructure pipeline. The Premier promoted the significant investment opportunities in the Western Sydney airport precinct.

The mission also provided a platform for the Premier to promote tourism opportunities to travel trade leaders at a Destination NSW led function.

Encouraged innovation links between Guangdong Province and NSW

The Premier visited China Merchants Group (CMG) to promote opportunities for collaboration between NSW and Guangdong businesses in smart cities technologies. She was able to support the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding on digital city research collaboration between the University of Technology Sydney (UTS) and CMG.

The Premier addressed a business luncheon attended by NSW business delegates and Shenzhen businesses. The Premier's address was vital in attracting senior Shenzhen business leaders to the event.

A visit to the Southern University of Science and Technology (SUSTech) allowed the Premier to witness the signing of a Key Technology Partnership between SUSTech and UTS, and experience the high end lab facilities on the SUSTech campus.

The Premier met with FinTech company Supwin Network Technology to discuss their presence and opportunities for growth in NSW. The Premier also conducted a site visit with intelligent speech technology company iFlytek to test their product firsthand and promote NSW as an innovation hub.

The Premier also visited the Guangdong Medical Valley to promote partnerships in the area of medical technologies and attended the opening ceremony of the China-Australia Medical Innovation Center. This Center will support links between NSW and Guangdong by acting as a landing pad and incubator for NSW medical organisations.

Manila, Philippines - 7 December 2017

Progressed investment opportunity in NSW

The Premier met with executives of Jollibee Foods, continuing the NSW Government's work to promote the state as a potential location for Jollibee Foods' first investment in Australia.

Promoted NSW business capability

The Premier met with the President and key management of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and promoted the capability of NSW businesses to assist the ADB to achieve its infrastructure objectives across the Asian region.

Strengthened bilateral relationships

The Premier's meeting with the Secretary of the Department of Trade and Industry reaffirmed the NSW Government's commitment to our relationship with the Philippines and encouraged continuing growth between both markets, particularly in relation to international education and people-to-people links.

This was further demonstrated by the Premier's visit to San Agustin Church in Intramuros to make a respectful gesture towards Philippine culture.
