# MISSION TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA BY THE HON. VICTOR DOMINELLO MP MINISTER FOR FINANCE, SERVICES AND PROPERTY 4 JANUARY – 14 JANUARY 2018

#### MISSION REPORT

## Purpose of travel

The Minister for Finance, Services and Property the Hon Victor Dominello MP travelled to New York, San Francisco and Seattle between 4 - 14 January to learn from comparable jurisdictions delivering world's best practice for evidence-based public policy, digital services, and data analytics.

He was joined by Minister Goward in Olympia and Seattle in Washington State to analyse the effectiveness of the Washington State Institute for Public Policy (WSIPP). The Institute is lauded as a model for effective meta-analysis and cost effectiveness of evidence-based programs delivered in Washington State and across the United States.

### Benefits of travel for the State of New South Wales

Evidence-based practice and public policy

The United States is regarded as a leader in evidence-based public policy. WSIPP was established in 1983 to provide the Washington State legislature with bipartisan research and analysis on the cost effectiveness of programs and services. WSIPP is widely respected by legislators, policy makers across the US and internationally.

For the last decade there has been a stronger focus on the implementation of evidence-based practice in social services in many states. NSW can learn from the US focus on evidence-based practice, commissioning, and meta-analysis.

Minister Dominello established the Social Innovation Council in June 2015, which he co-chairs with Tracy Howe (CEO of NCOSS). The Council is a strategic partnership between the NSW Government and the Forum of Non-Government Agencies (FONGA). It aims to accelerate innovation in the way human services are designed, delivered and measured, and to improve human services outcomes by:

- promoting the use of technology and collaborative work practices to optimise service delivery
- improving the quality and accessibility of human services data for government and Non-Government Organisations (NGOs)
- driving strategic engagement of the NGO sector
- making it easier for NGOs and Government to do business together

Insights gained from the trip will help inform the work of the Council and the Government's approach to evidence based contracting, the roll-out of digital services and our ongoing commitment to the benefits of open data and data analytics.
